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Long Term Goals to 2022 and beyond

Over the past year we have gathered input from our member clubs, event participants, and from the association's committees. Analyzing the feedback, three essential priorities stood out to aid in guiding our sport over the next five years and to lay a foundation of long term growth and achievement of bowls in Alberta, as well as nationally and internationally.

Except for membership fees, our association has previously relied solely on external revenue sources. We recognize a need to broaden our sources of revenue to not only survive, but to thrive. In 2016, Dignity Memorial became a sponsor for our provincial Senior Triples competition. In 2017, a partnership with two hotels provided discounted rates to association members while also providing commission to our organization. Our goal is to build upon this partnership and seek other revenue opportunities such as sponsors for events, donations from participants, and organized fundraisers.

To grow our sport, the member clubs need to be vibrant and highly visible in their communities. We need to offer them support in meeting the biggest challenges they struggle with. Our association must aim to facilitate increased collaboration among the clubs to ensure they share best practices, support each other in hosting events, and meet their needs of increasing membership. A representative from each member club on the newly formed Marketing & Membership Committee will create an avenue for creating awareness of our sport and increased participation in bowls not only in the neighborhoods of the clubs but across the province.

Quality is achieved when there is a commitment to follow a process of continual improvement. Recently, our organization has advanced in several areas including development of coaches, increased participation from social bowlers in provincial events, providing resources for athlete development, and recognizing outstanding achievements in the sport. We need to be more intentional in striving for excellence in all dimensions of our sport. Identifying and providing skill development opportunities for athletes, increasing youth participation, qualifying umpires serving at the club, provincial, and national level, and supporting and encouraging coaches are some of the ways we can attain higher standards in complimentary dimensions of the sport.
